Sandsend North Yorkshire

Sunrise lights up rocks covered in seaweed, sandstone cliffs and the alluring long sandy beach at Sandsend. Rock pools can be explored at low tide and fossils may be found in the cliff base. There is superb coastal walking along the Cleveland Way, which follows clifftops from Saltburn-by-the-Sea, through Whitby and Scarborough to Filey. The origins of Sandsend date back to the development of the alum industry. A railway line linking Whitby to Teesside was built in 1883 and closed in 1958.

Shepherd Wheel Millpond South Yorkshire

Shepherd Wheel is a fascinating working museum in a former water-powered grinding workshop. The working waterwheel is 5.5m in diameter, powered by a large dam with water diverted from the Porter Brook in the southwest of the City of Sheffield. Dating from the 1500s, it was one of many small water-powered grinding workshops along Sheffield's rivers. The workshop played an instrumental role in the city's cutlery industry up until the 1930s and is the earliest complete example of its kind.

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Bridlington Marina East Yorkshire

The Yorkshire Belle pleasure cruiser moored near the harbour wall in Bridlington or 'Brid' which lies just south of Flamborough Head in Bridlington Bay. Enclosed by two stone piers, the magnificent harbour and fishing port was established where the Gypsy Race stream runs into the sea. In the 19th century it grew into a seaside resort after the discovery of a mineral spring. Bridlington is well known for its shellfish and is popular for sea angling trips or further out to local shipwrecks.

Swaledale North Yorkshire

This wide, lush, open valley is the northernmost of the Yorkshire Dales. The River Swale rushes through a landscape of hills, waterfalls and lush meadows grazed by Swaledale sheep. The small fields are crisscrossed by drystone walls with characteristic stone barns, whose top section is used to store hay and the lower section for overwintering cattle. Parts of the upland landscape are scarred with the remains of the former lead mining, which reached its peak in Swaledale in the 19th century.

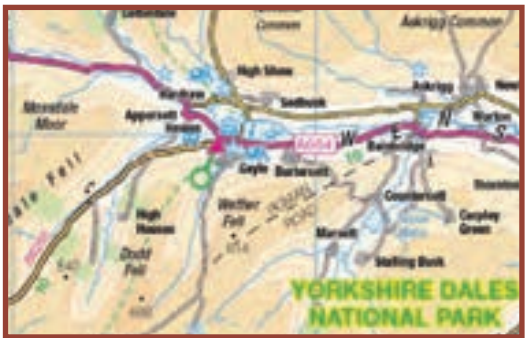
Gale Beck Waterfall Yorkshire Dales

Meandering through beautiful Hawes, Gayle Beck runs right between the town's homes, creating an attractive waterfall as it flows into the countryside from the River Ure. The market town of Hawes has a livestock market and a history of sheep farming and rope making. At the Wensleydale Creamery visitors can watch the famous cheese being produced. The largest of the Dales, Wensleydale is a long broad valley, a serene landscape of terraced hills, pastures, dry-stone walls and stone buildings.

Ripon North Yorkshire

This small city on the edge of the Dales has a magnificent 7th century cathedral, quaint medieval streets with small alleys, fascinating historic buildings, shops, cafes and museums, and a fine Georgian marketplace. Founded over 1,300 years ago, it boasts a wealth of cultural heritage. There are three unusual museums – the Courthouse, Ripon Workhouse, and the Prison and Police Museum. Three rivers meet in Ripon and there are scenic walks along the canal and nature reserve near the racecourse.

Burton Agnes Hall East Yorkshire

This red brick Elizabethan Manor House with many windows and square and semicircular projecting bays was built by the architect Robert Smythson from 1601-10. It was owned for over 400 years by the Griffin family, whose passion for art collecting has left a fine collection of paintings, tapestries and furniture. The gardens boast 3,000 plant species, with lawns and topiary, an Elizabethan walled garden and a woodland area with sculptures. The Hall hosts exhibitions of work by local artists.

The Hole of Horcum North York Moors

A sweeping view of the Hole of Horcum, with a sea of purple heather blooming. This spectacular natural amphitheatre 120m deep and 0.75km wide was, according to local folklore, formed when a giant called Wade picked up and threw earth at someone with whom he was arguing, creating the massive hollow in the land. The North York Moors National Park covers a very diverse landscape – deep forests, wooded dales, dramatic coastal scenery and heather moorland, which makes up 35% of the National Park.

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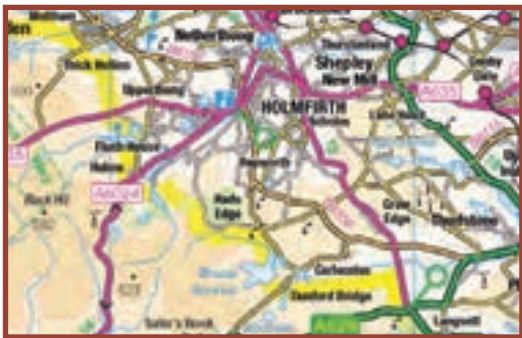

Hepworth West Yorkshire

This village set amid rolling hills and lush green fields is home to traditional stone houses and a historic church. It was frequently used as a location in the BBC series *Last of the Summer Wine*. It is situated on the hillside above the valley of Rakes Dike, which flows into the River Holme. A regular event in the village each June is Hepworth Feast, a procession accompanied by the brass band, originally as a thanksgiving for the end of the 1665 plague which claimed many lives in Hepworth.

Langsett Reservoir South Yorkshire

At the north of the Peak District National Park, Langsett is the biggest supply reservoir in the Sheffield area, with one of the largest earth embankments in the UK. It is one of three reservoirs built in the 1890s to provide water for Sheffield, Barnsley, Doncaster and Rotherham. The mixed woodland habitats attract birds such as warblers, flycatchers and woodpeckers. Many walking, cycling and horse-riding routes through woods and moorland have been created, with fine views across the waters.

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Beverley East Yorkshire

This charming market town is dominated by the two towers of the 13th century Minster, built on the site of a former monastery, a prominent landmark across the flat landscape. Founded around 700AD by Saint John of Beverley, the town continued to grow, especially under Norman rule. Beverley has England's oldest Grammar School, founded in 700AD, and a famous racecourse, which dates back to 1690. Cobbled streets lead to the market cross standing at the heart of Beverley's ancient market place.

Pen-y-ghent Yorkshire Dales

One of the most renowned fells in the Dales, Pen-y-ghent is the third highest of the Yorkshire Three Peaks, 694m high. Its domed outline dominates the surrounding landscape and has been likened to a crouching lion. It can be climbed from the village of Horton-in-Ribblesdale, following the Pennine Way across rugged moorland and over the summit, passing two deep potholes, Hunt Pot and Hull Pot. There are spectacular views of the other peaks, Wharfedale and Ingleborough, and the Forest of Bowland.
